The CFTC said on Tuesday it did not oppose the requested amount. Acting CFTC Chairman Caroline Pham said in a prior statement that the agency's conduct was "inexcusable." --Law firm Kasowitz Benson Torres is representing Ford Motor in a lawsuit in federal court in California accusing several law firms and lawyers of fraudulently inflating their legal fees in cases brought under the state's Lemon Law designed to protect vehicle owners.

The attorneys that allegedly anchored the scheme regularly brought in other law firms to overstaff cases, Ford alleged in its complaint 🖸 on Wednesday.






